Transfer Admission Guarantees Tips for UC Santa Cruz TAGs Fall 2020

When to write a TAG:

- UCSB will accept TAGs September 1 September 30.
- Students must also submit the UC admissions application November 1-30.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Have completed a minimum of 30 UC-transferable semester units of the required 60 units of course work (45 of 90 quarter units) at the time of application
- Have fewer than 20 semester units (30 quarter units) of upper-division coursework at a four-year college/university
- Have at least a 3.00 GPA by the end of fall 2019
- English 1A completed by the end of fall 2019
- College-level math (UC-M) completed by the end of fall 2019
- Be enrolled at a participating California community college
- Minimum 30 transferable semester units from a California community college.
- Minimum 7 GE courses required for UC eligibility (2 English, 1 math, and 4 additional courses).
- Completion of all transfer requirements by end of spring prior to transfer.
- In good standing at SRJC.
- <u>Selective Majors</u>: UCSC will be screening for major preparation in the areas of Applied Physics, Art and Design, Biochemistry and Molecular Bio, Biological Sciences (including Human, Marine, Molecular, Cell, and Developmental), Biomolecular Engineering and Bioinformatics, Business Management Econ, Chemistry, Cognitive Science, Computer Engineering, Computer Science/Game Design, Ecology and Evolution, Economics, Econ/Math combined major, Electrical Engineering, Environmental Sciences, Environmental Studies (including combined majors), Global Economics, Network and Digital Technology, Neuroscience, Physics, Plant Sciences, Psychology, Robotics Engineering, Sociology, and Tech and Info Management. International Applicants:

Non-native speakers of English must demonstrate proficiency in English. You can learn more at <u>UCSC's English Proficiency Requirement</u> page.

TAG's NOT available for:

- Students who are not in good standing at their community college (or last college attended)
- Former UC students who left the UC not in good academic standing
- Former UCSC students, who must apply for readmission to the campus
- Students who, prior to transfer, will reach or exceed 90 semester (135 quarter) units (after applying UC lower division limitations and exclusions) of combined community and four-year college transferable coursework
- Students who have earned a bachelor's degree
- Students who are currently enrolled at a high school

<u>More Tips:</u>

- Choice of major is not guaranteed through TAG unless the major is listed under "UCSC TAG Major Preparation Selection Criteria". See UCSC TAG Web Site for additional information.
- Non-native speakers of English must demonstrate proficiency in English (see complete UCSC TAG guidelines for details).
- A Student with a TAG must submit an application for admission and insight questions during the November 1 30 priority application period.
- Notice of changes in progress and planned coursework must be in writing and include the student's complete schedule (not just courses added and dropped).
- PE *Activity* courses 4 units will transfer and the grades for the best 4 units can be used. Most Phy Ed courses are considered *Activity* courses. Some ATHL courses are also considered *Activity* courses and are subject to the same limits; others are considered *Theory* and subject to higher limits. There are no limitations on the number of units for DANCE courses.
- Transferable courses from all colleges attended must be used to determine the UC transfer GPA.
