UC Davis Fall 2022 Tips for TAGs

When to write a TAG:

- UCD will accept TAGs September 1-30.
- Students must also submit the UC admissions application November 1-30.

Eligibility Criteria:

- 30 transferable units <u>completed</u> (and grades posted) at time of writing TAG (30 unit minimum can include AP and IB credit).
- 60 transferable units completed by the end of spring 2022.
- Meet UC admission requirements in English and math (2 English courses & 1 math course) by the end of fall 2021. The remainder of courses required for the 7-course eligibility requirement must be completed by the end of spring 2022.
- Minimum transferable GPA varies by college (see below). Students must meet the GPA requirement at the time the TAG is written and maintain it through the remainder of their transfer work, with no grade below a "C".
- You must have been enrolled at a CCC for the spring term prior to applying for the UC Davis TAG and you must plan to enroll at a CCC for all academic terms prior to your transfer date. Full-time enrollment is strongly recommended to be best prepared for the rigors of UC Davis. Students who are enrolled part-time between Spring 2021 and Spring 2022 should provide an explanation in the Additional Comments section of the TAG application.
- Students must meet or exceed the minimum group GPA for their selective major from the time their TAGs are submitted up to the time of enrollment.
- Students cannot be enrolled simultaneously in a CCC and a university or exclusively at a university when or after the TAG is written. This provision prohibits cross-enrollment at SSU or UC Berkeley. (Exceptions can be made for summer enrollment at the discretion of the UC Davis representative). The summer 2022 session may not be used to complete courses required to meet UC eligibility, the 60 transferable semester units, or for courses required for selection to the major. Students attending the UC during summer session must obtain C grades or higher to remain in good academic standing at the UC.

TAG Criteria by College:

College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences

- Overall 3.20 GPA
- The following majors are considered Selective Majors and have other course completion and GPA requirements posted on the SRJC Transfer Center website and in the UC Davis TAG website.
 - o Biotechnology
 - Managerial Economics
 - Viticulture and Enology

• For the Landscape Architecture major students submit their TAG for Pre-Landscape Architecture. Refer to the UC Davis TAG website for additional information.

College of Biological Sciences

- Overall 3.20 GPA
- All majors in the College of Biological Sciences are considered Selective Majors. Please refer to additional course completion and GPA requirements posted on the SRJC Transfer Center website and the UC Davis TAG website.

College of Engineering

- Overall 3.50 GPA
- All majors in the College of Engineering are considered Selective Majors. Please refer to additional course completion and GPA requirements posted on the SRJC Transfer Center website and in the UC Davis TAG website.

College of Letters and Science

- Overall 3.20 GPA
- Effective for Fall 2022 applicants, the Computer Science major is no longer open to TAG
- The following majors are considered Selective Majors and have other course completion and GPA requirements posted on the SRJC Transfer Center website and the UC Davis TAG website.
 - Applied Mathematics
 - Applied Physics
 - o Economics
 - Mathematics
 - o Mathematical Analytics and Operations Research
 - Mathematical and Scientific Computations
 - o Pharmaceutical Chemistry
 - o Physics
 - o Psychology

TAGs are NOT available for:

- Students who have Baccalaureate degrees.
- Students attending high school in fall 2021, even if simultaneously enrolled at a CCC.
- Former UC students who left UC not in good academic standing.
- Former UC Davis students except for students enrolled only in summer sessions.
- Students who have a combination of lower division, upper division, and UC units that are equal or greater than 80 ("senior standing"). All <u>lower division</u> units, whether from a 2-year and/or 4-year college/university are limited to a maximum of 70 semester units toward the UC degree and do not put applicants at risk of being denied admission for excessive units. <u>Exception</u>: The College of Engineering will consider applicants who have 80 or more semester (120 quarter) units of transfer credit after UC lower-division unit limitations and exclusions have been applied.
